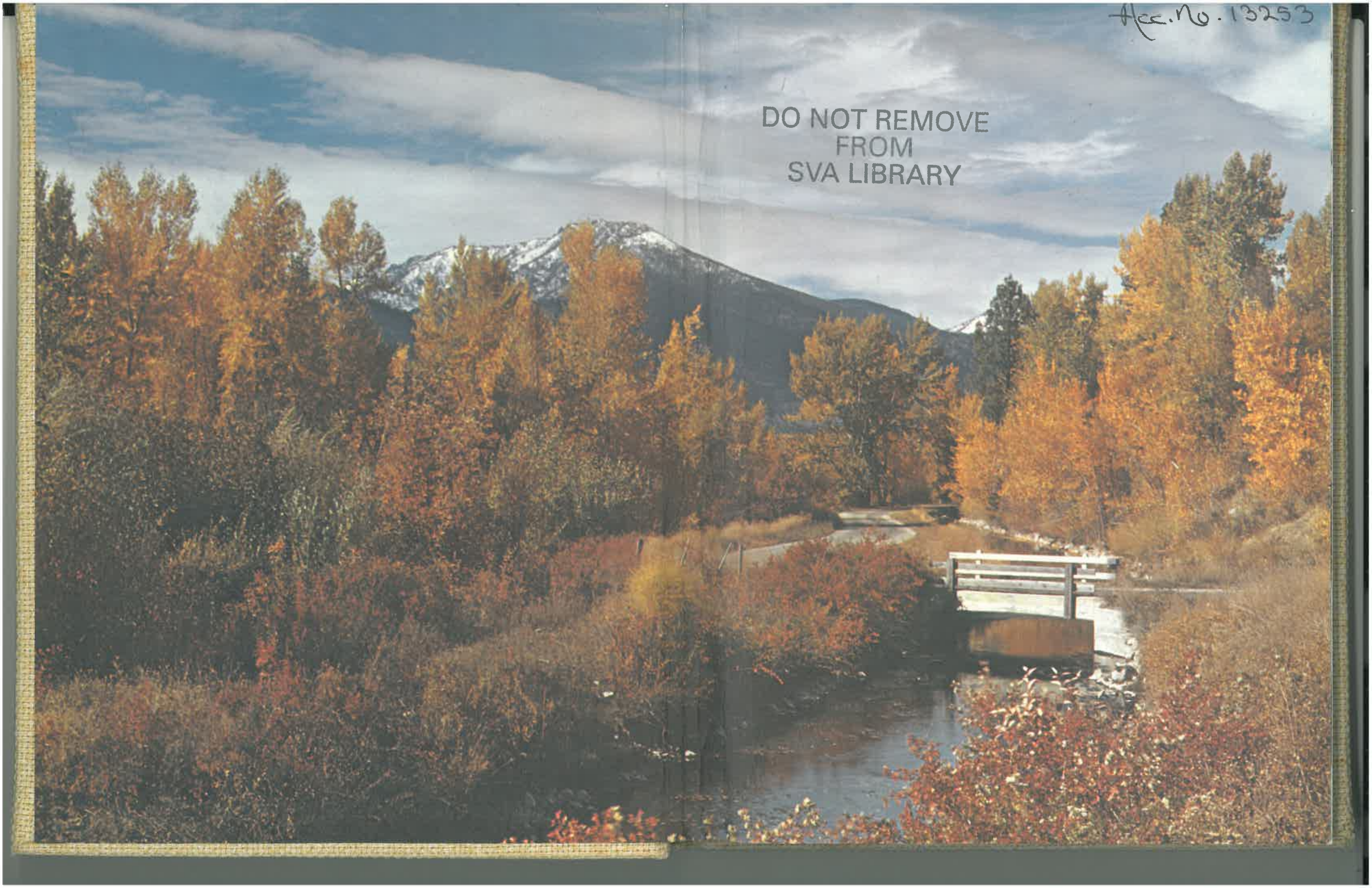

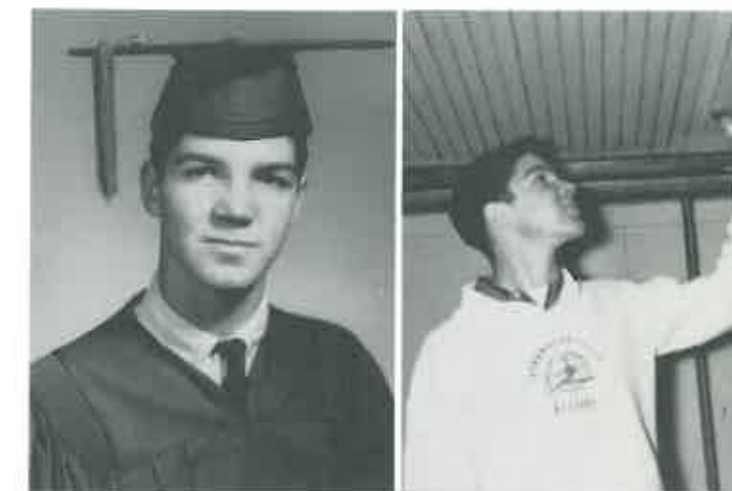


RICHARD WARREN GRIFFIN
