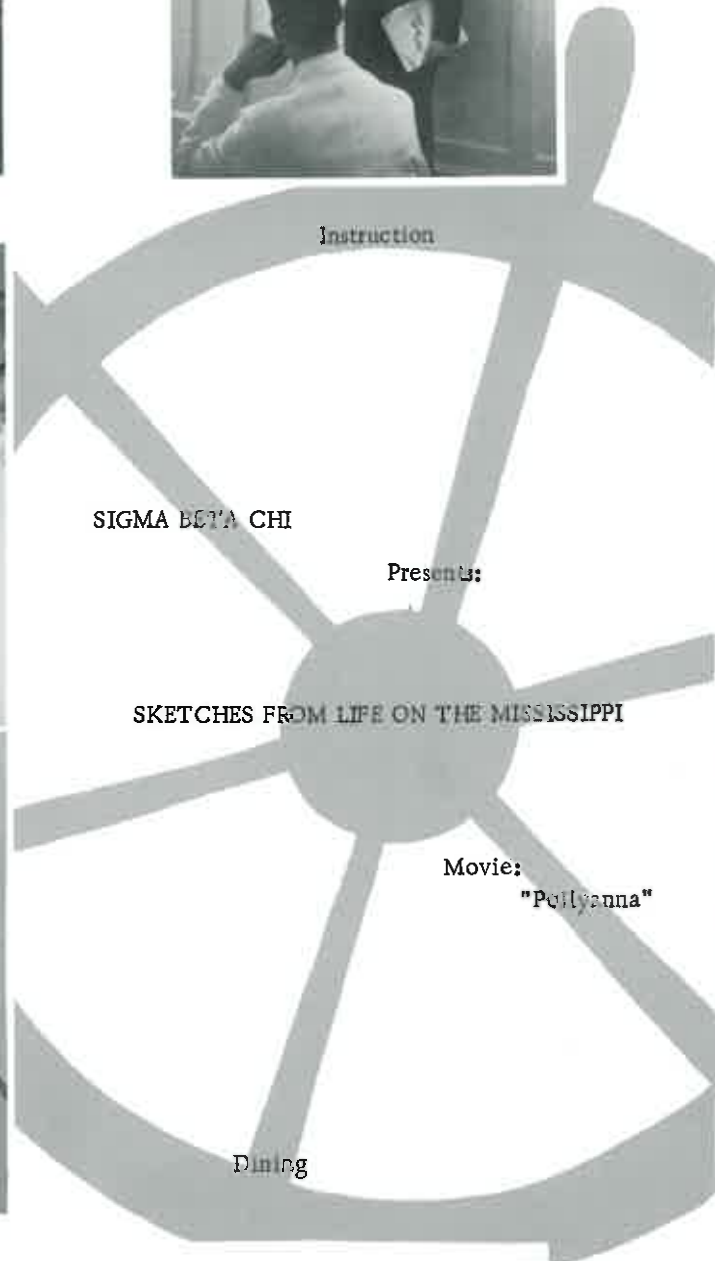

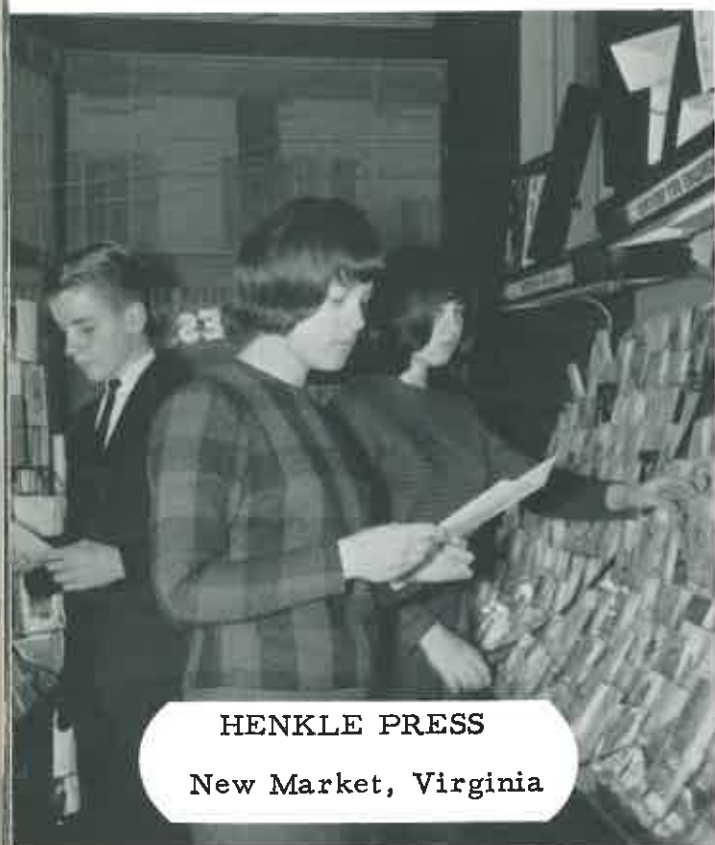


OUR SHENANDOAH
