





CLASSES

LESS THOMAS CHAFEN



GLEN RONALD DeVAUGHN



WALTER EMERSON HAMANN, JR.



CHARLES EDWARD JACOBS, JR.





GLOYD EUGENE ROBINSON



LOIS MARIE STILLWELL



FREDA MARLENE WEST



LINDA LEE WHITE


