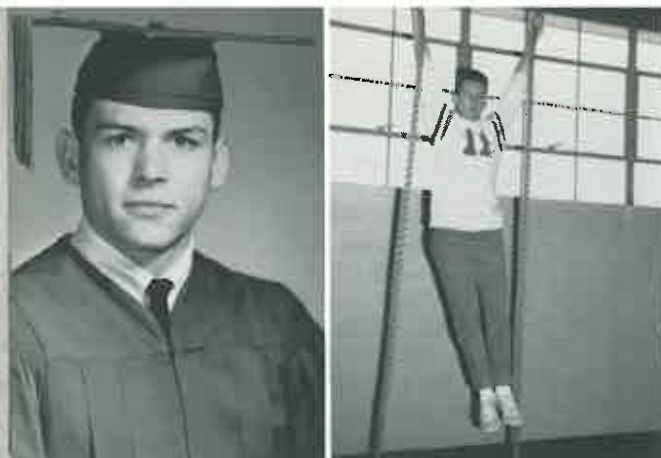
WILLIAM THOMAS BRYDEN

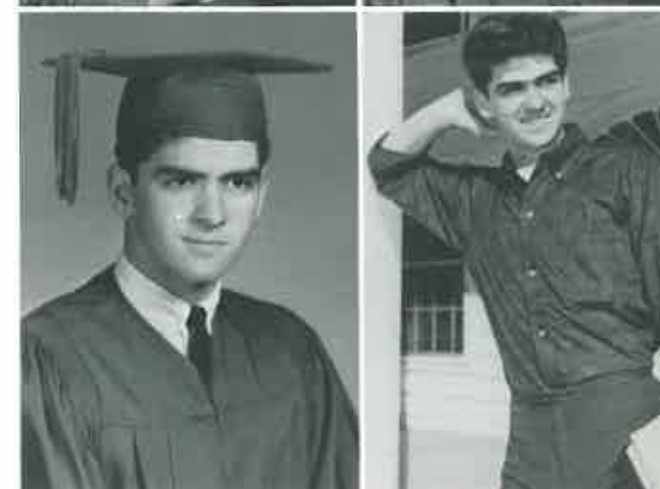
MARSHALL EDWARD CONNER

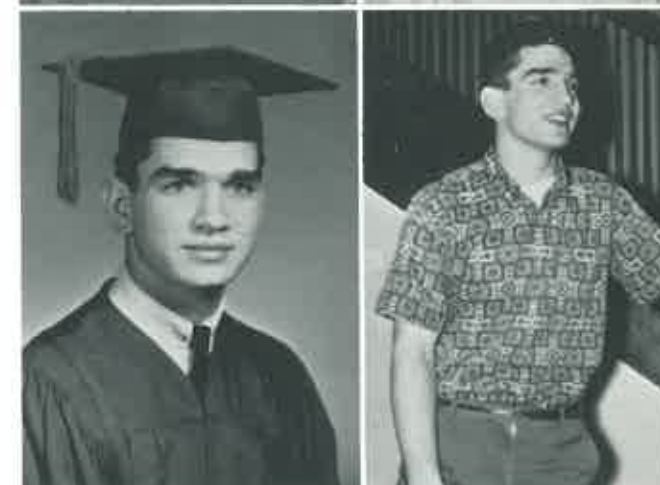
LINDA SUE HARLESS

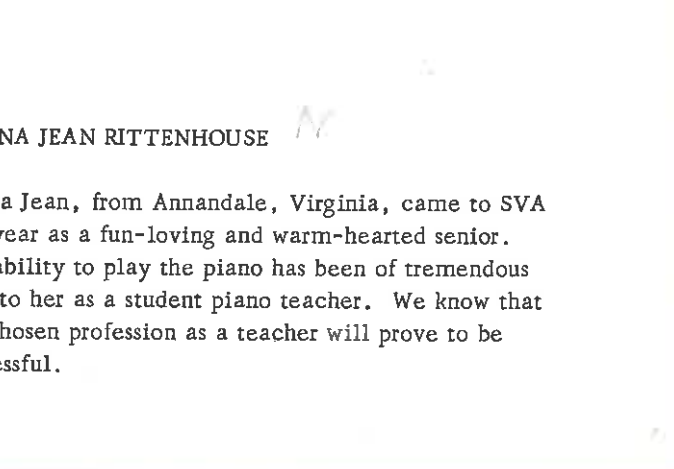
LAWRENCE ELBERT PESTER
