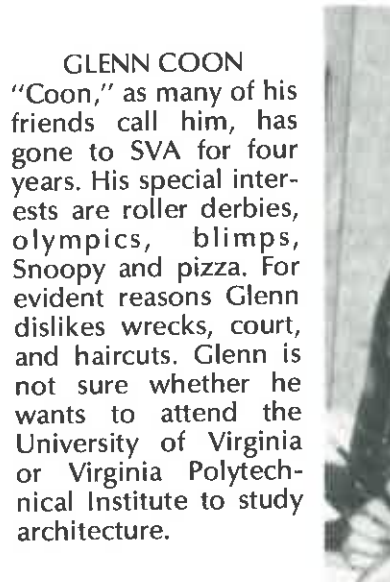
LINDA FENTRESS

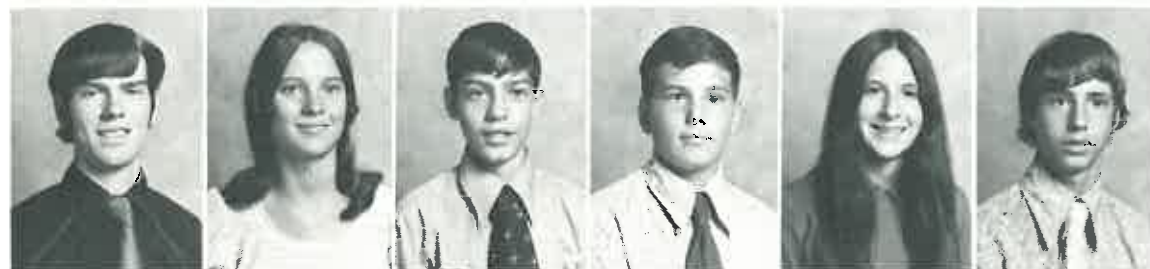

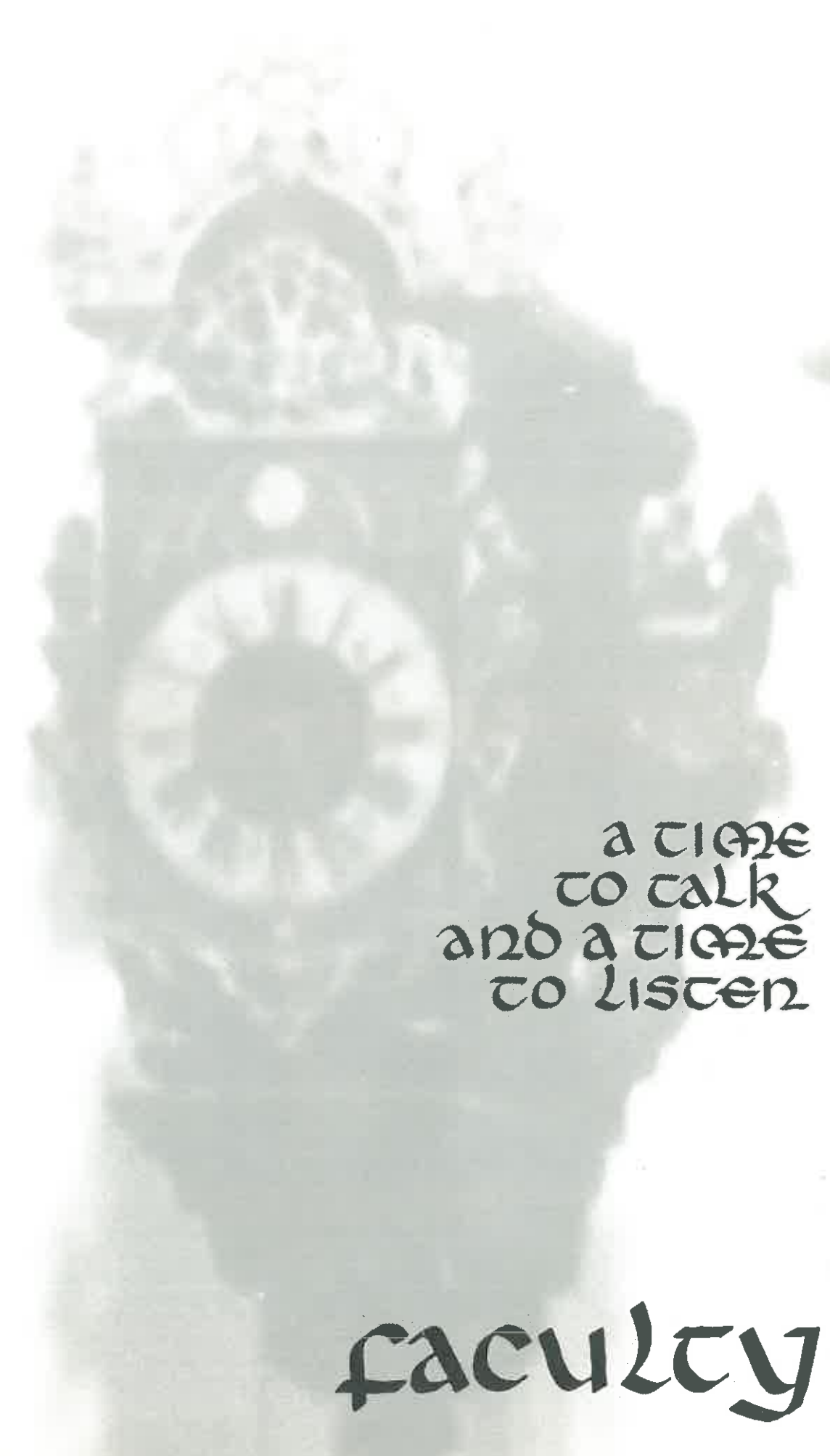

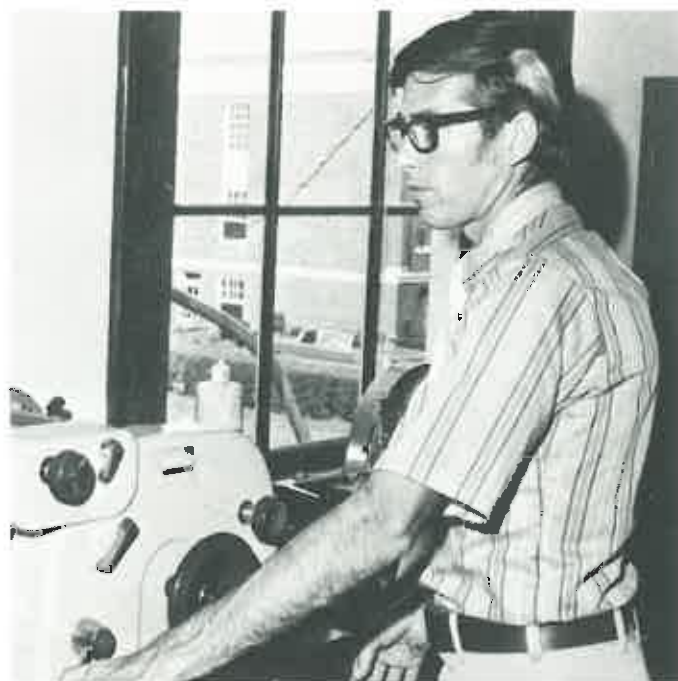
WILLIAM JOHNSTON, B.A.
