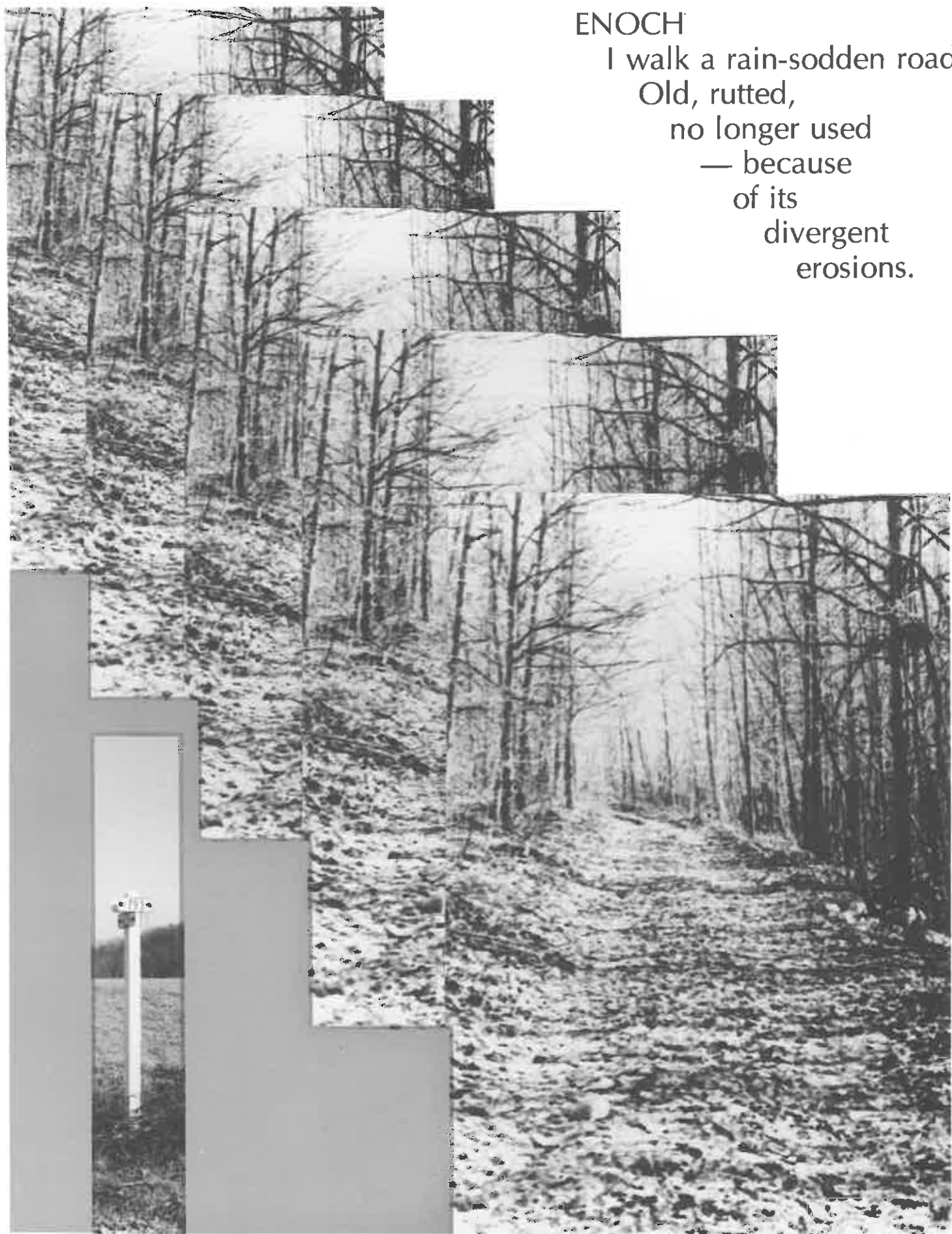

Of liquid music.

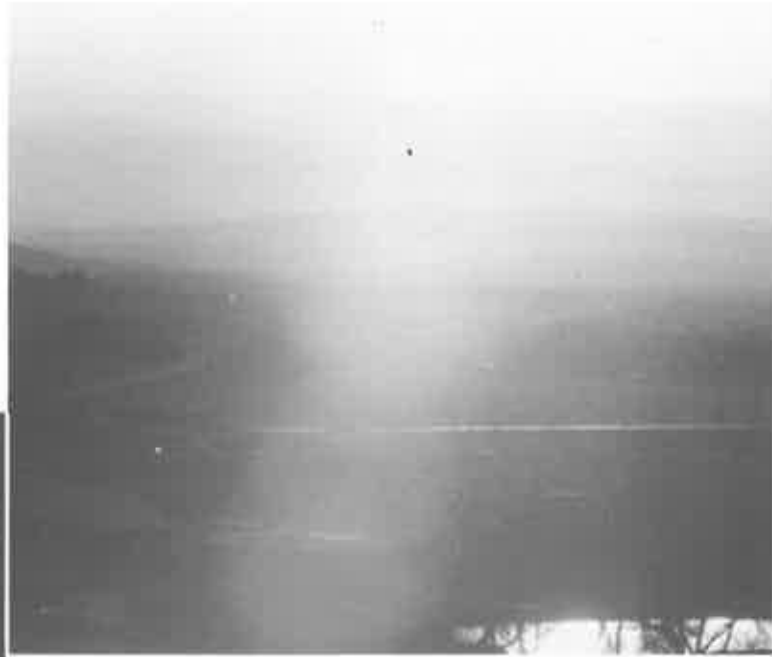

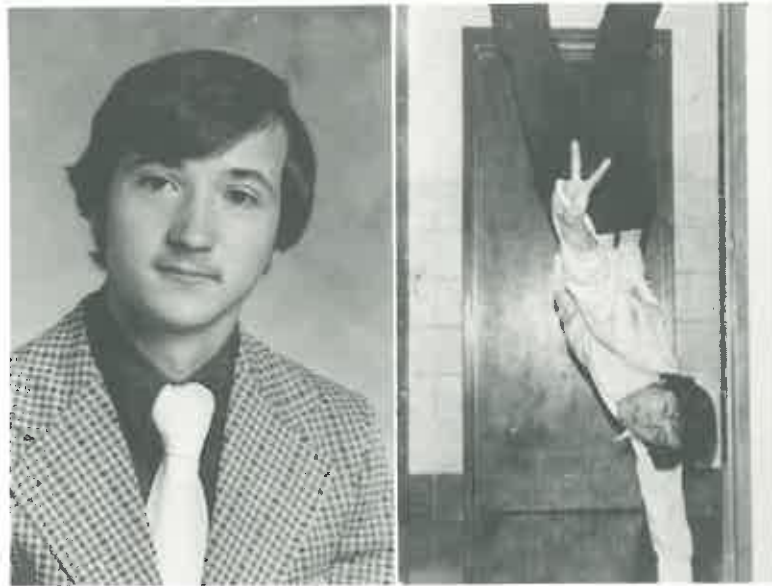
YOLANDA MARIE ABRIL *TV*

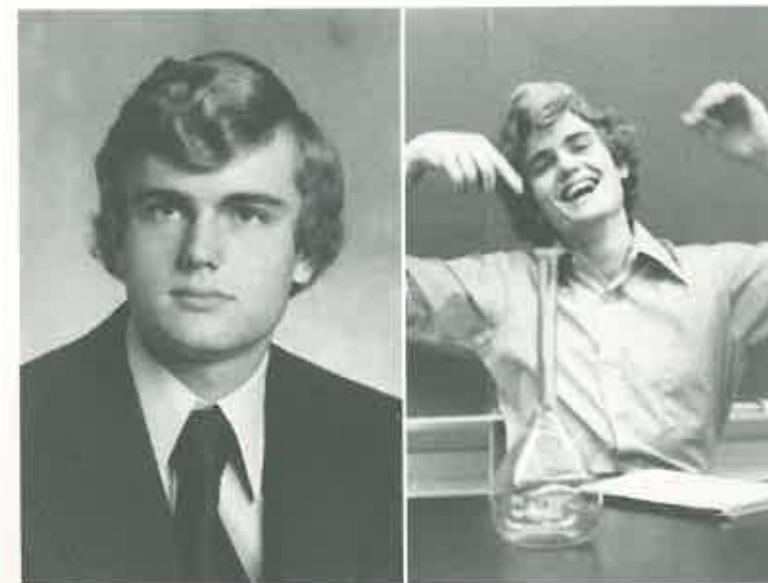
SHERYL ROBIN BUCKLEW

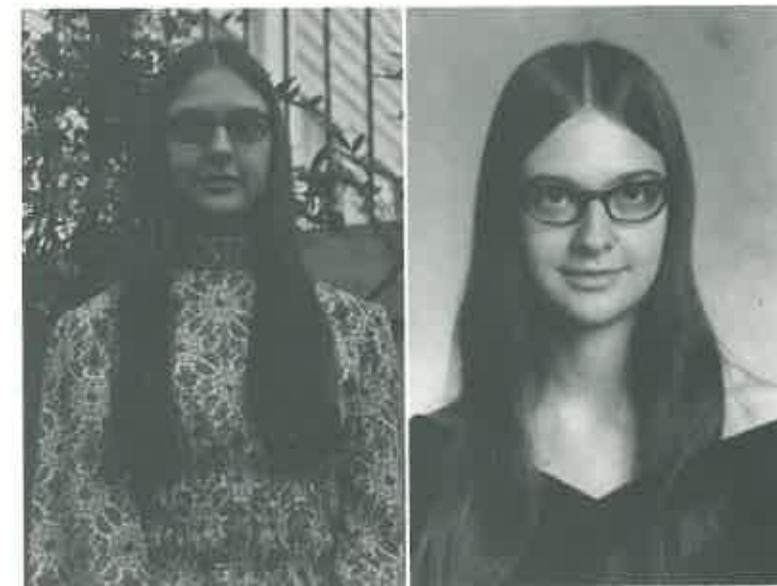


JUDITH AMELIA COLLINS ✓

PATRICIA ROXANNE FABER

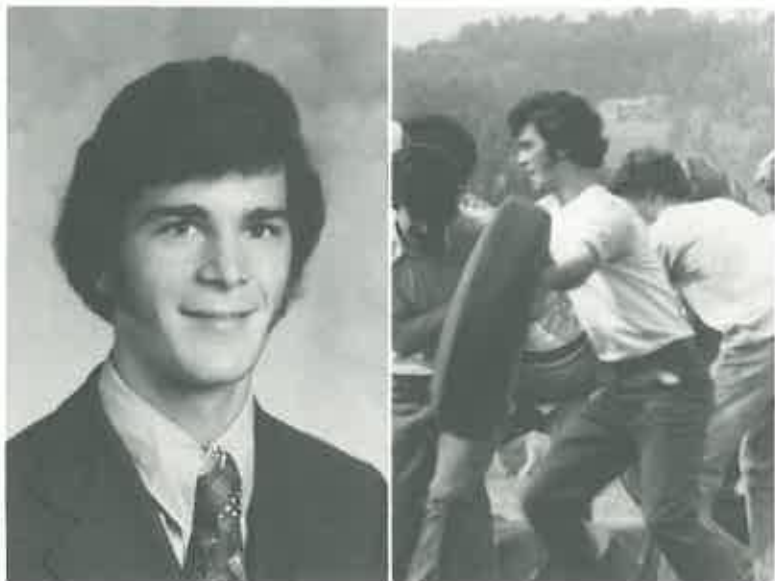

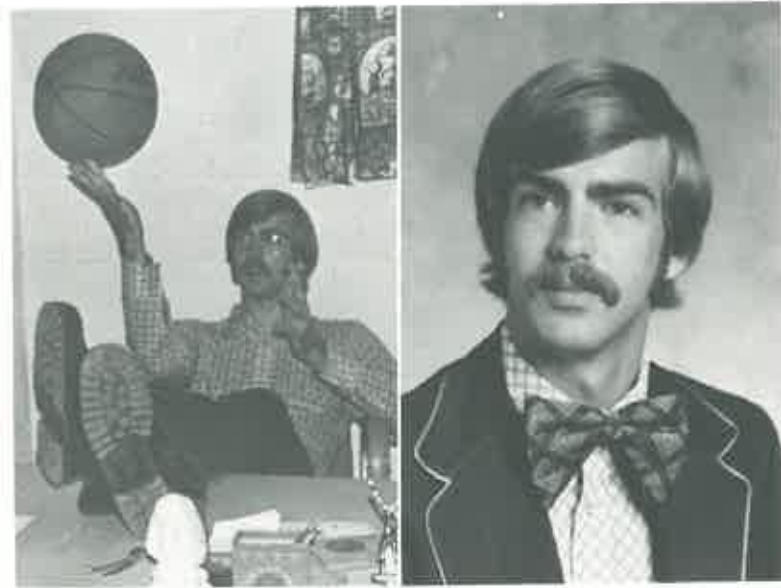


DENISE JOYCE *Yes VA*

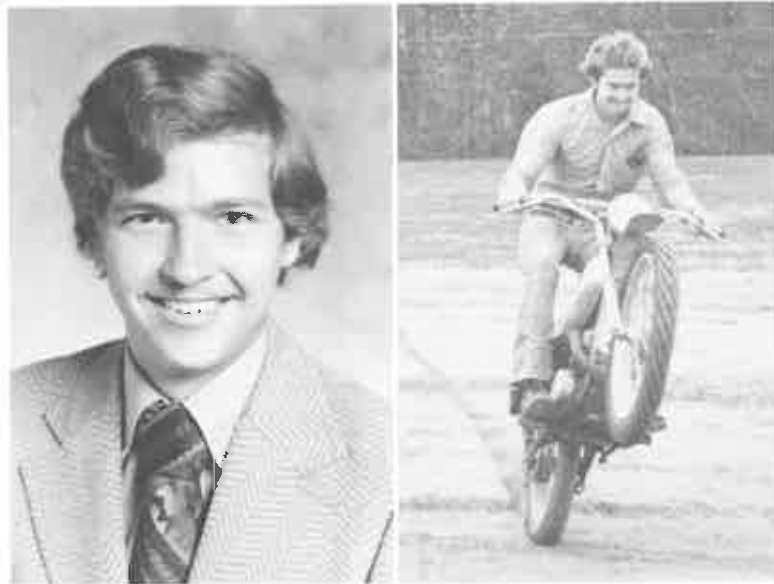
C. THOMAS MCNUITY *VA NW Airlines*

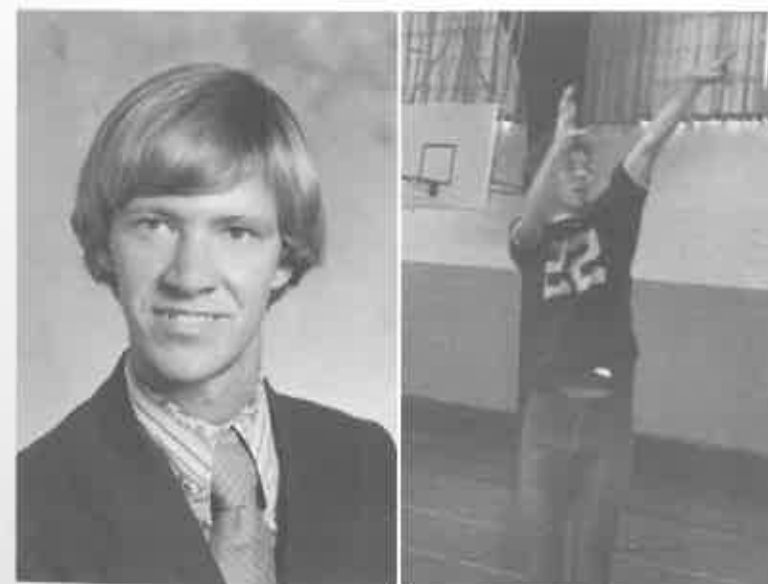
BRENDA GAY PALMER *no*

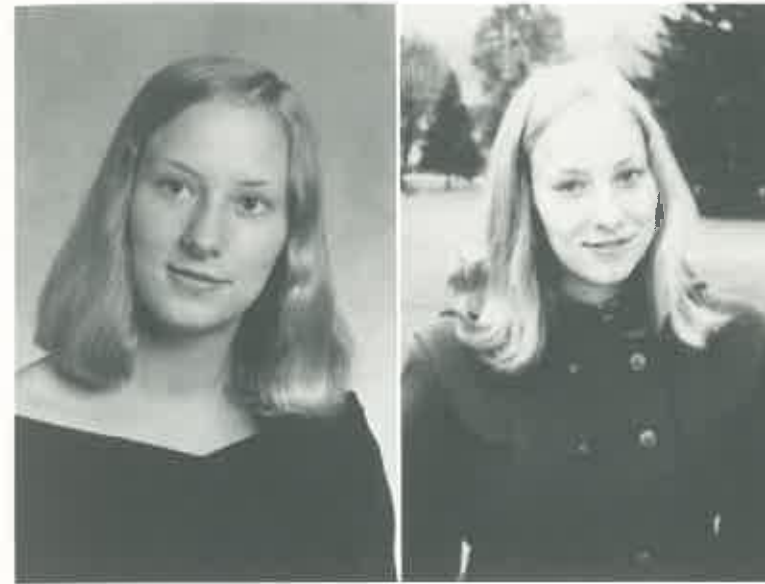
DONNA JEAN PHILLIPS

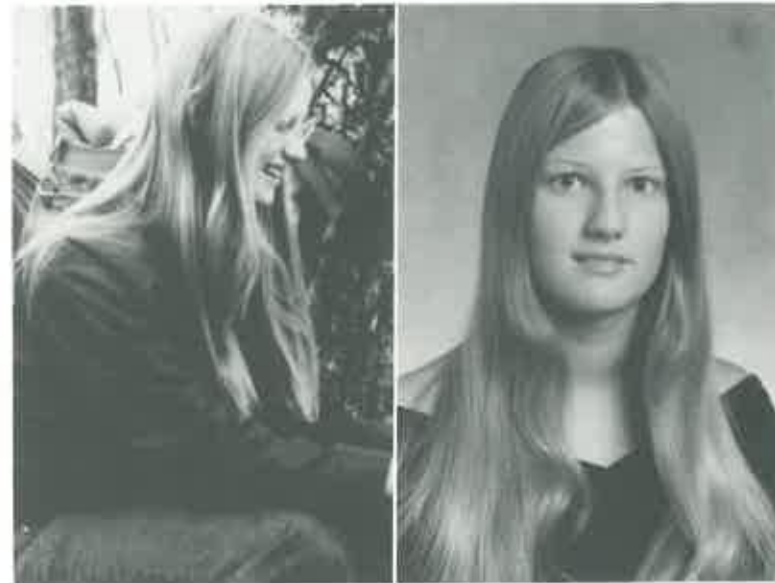
JEFFREY BROOKS TURNER

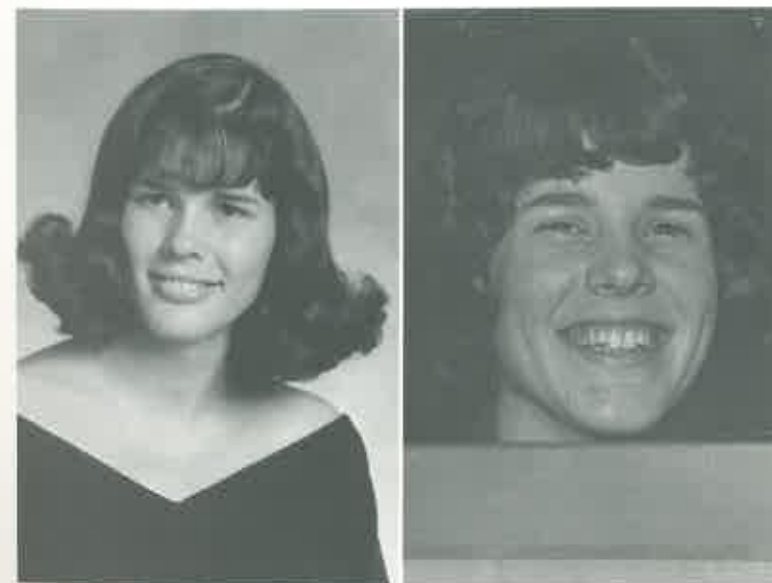

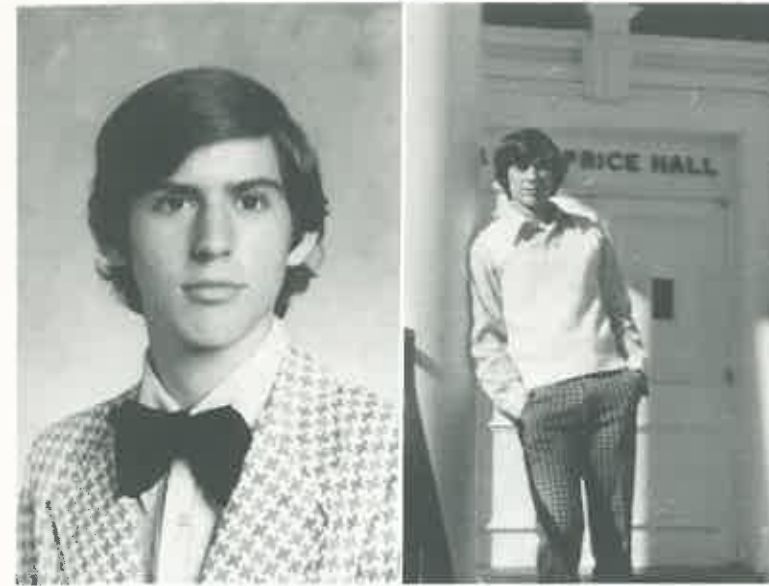

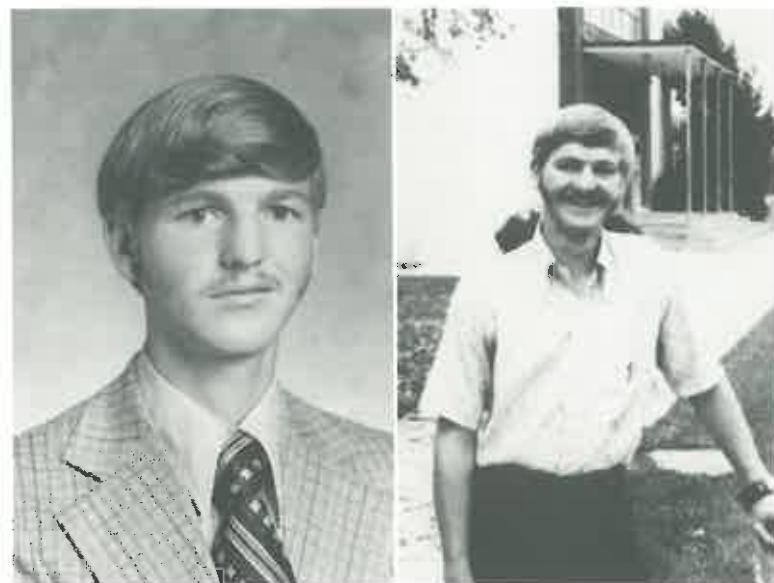
THOMAS CARLYLE WOODS

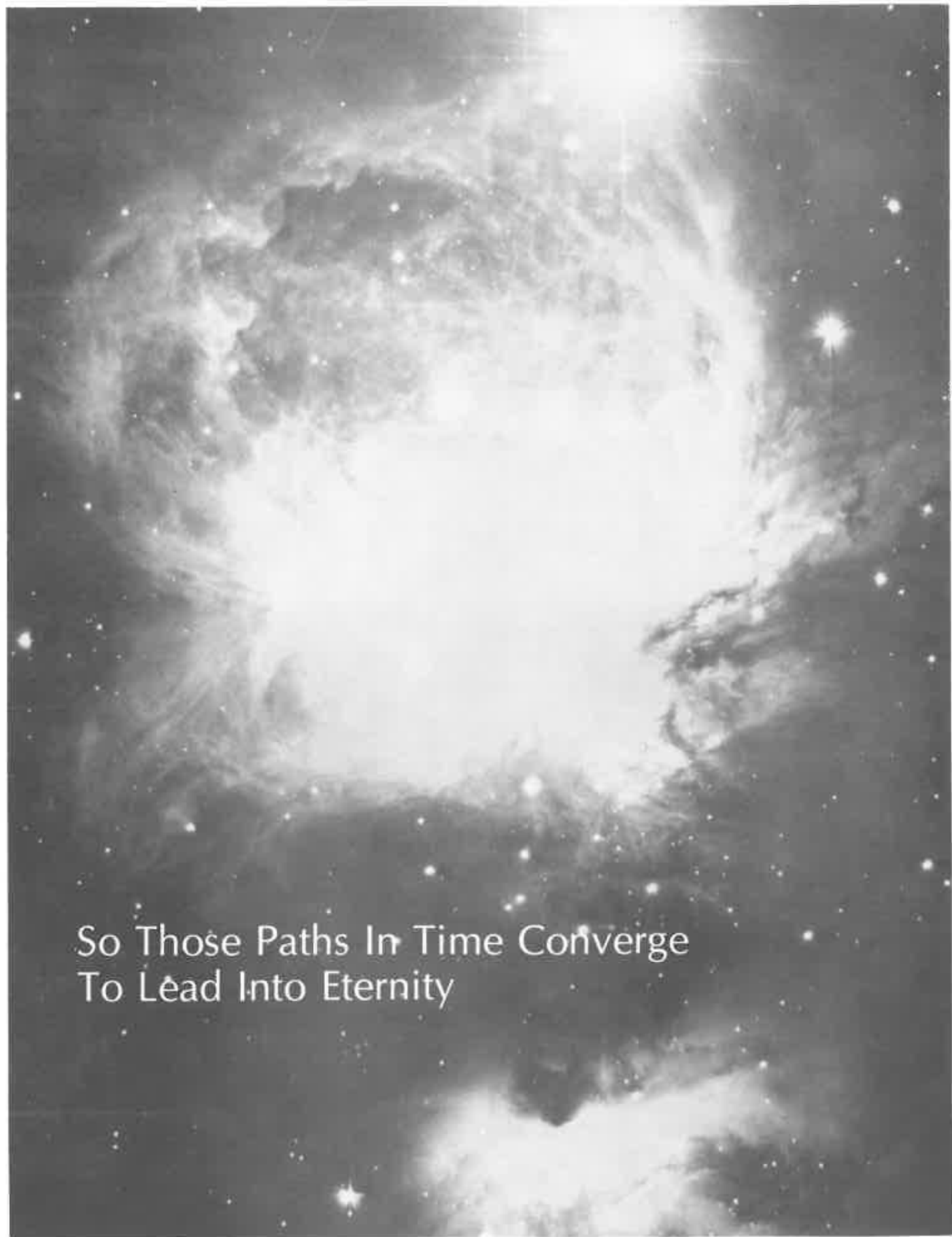
BENJAMIN EDWARD WHITEHURST *yes*

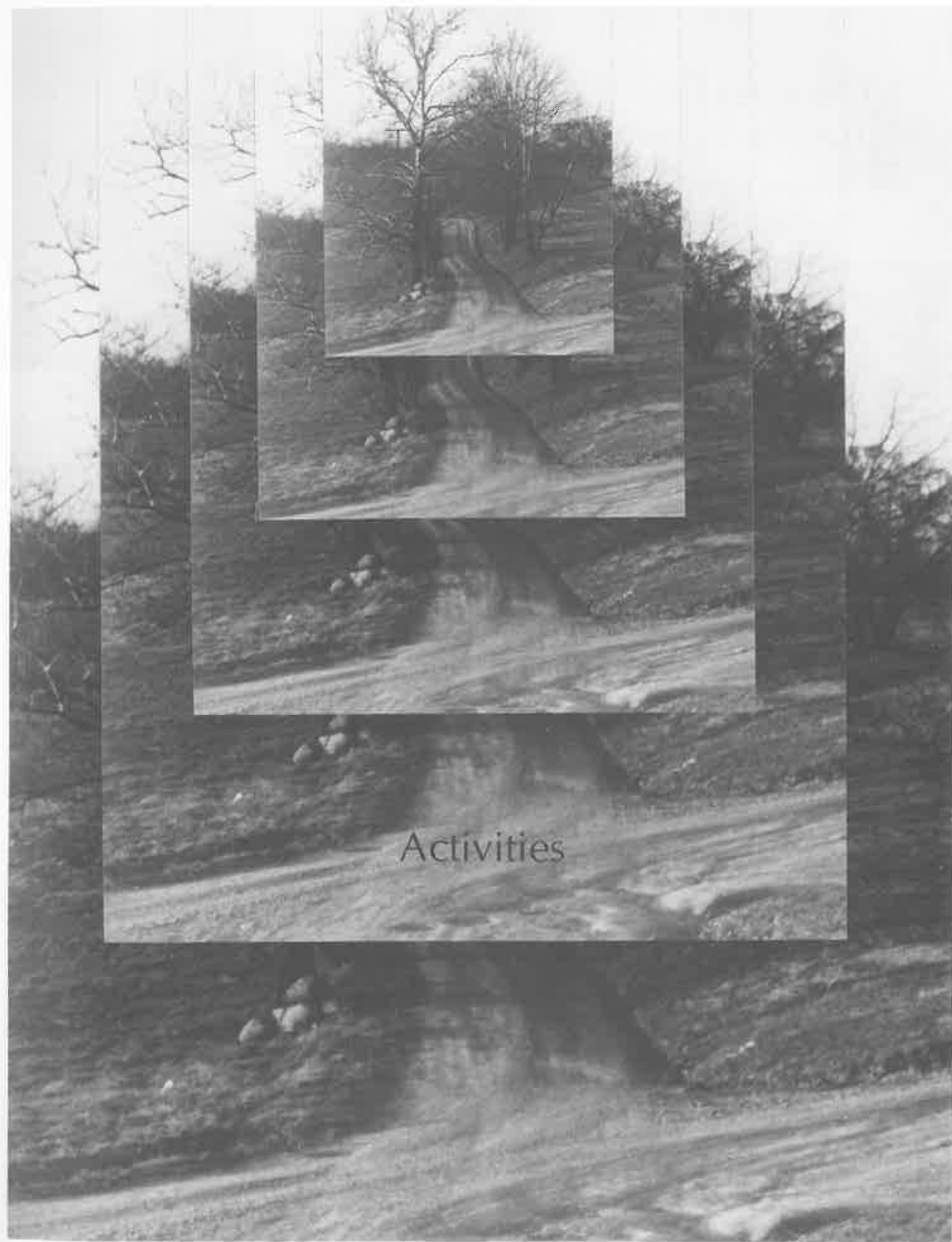


JUDITH LEE WRIGHT *yes Nurse Pract.*
