









S.A. Fall Picnic
























50 Years of Memories

This 1982 Shenandoan marks the 50th year of yearbooking at S.V.A. The first yearbook, published in 1932, was a 64 page paper-back under the name "Shenandoah." It contained pictures of students, faculty, and various organizations, presentations of Senior Class Poem, Song, Will, etc., and was dedicated to the faculty of S.V.A.


Except for 1945 and 1946 when no book was formally published because of wartime restrictions, a memory book has been published every year. It evolved from a 64 page, black and white paper back under the name "Shenandoah" to a 144 page, colorful hardback volume called the Shenandoan. This marks 50 years of yearbooking at Shenandoah Valley Academy, the pictures, the thoughts, and the memories can be cherished for a lifetime, and beyond.

The name of the yearbook was changed in 1956 from "Shenan-doah" to the "Shenandoan." This is part of the title page of that book.


