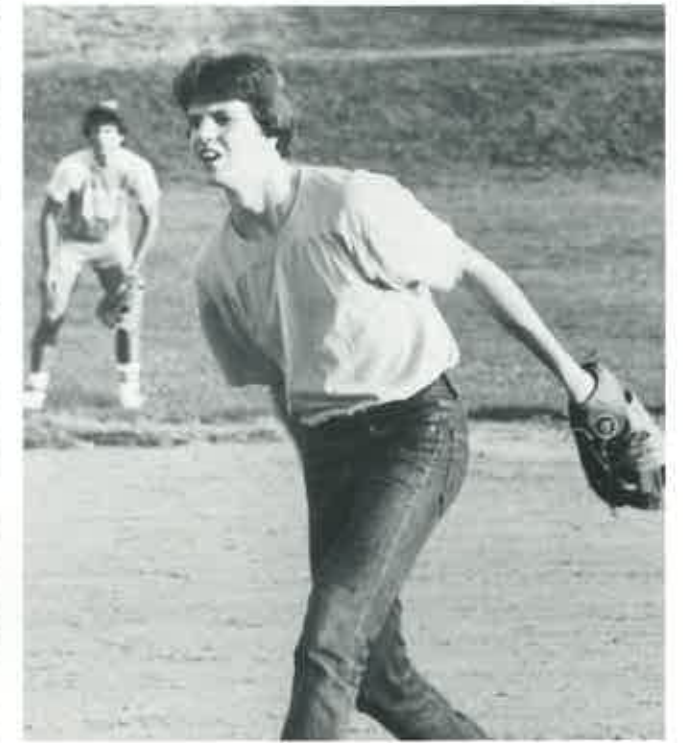

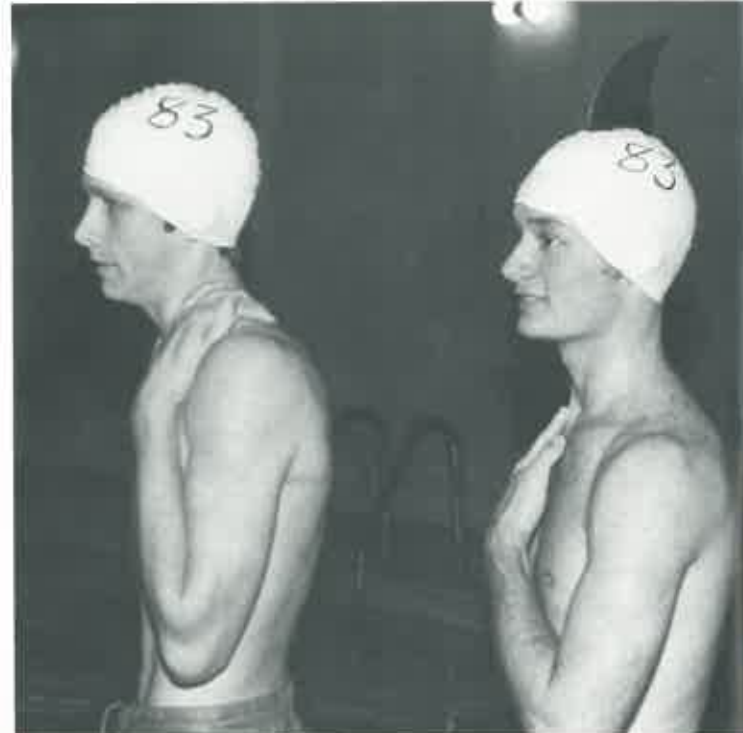

In the weight lifting contest this year there were several girls' records set and a couple of guys' records broken. Dwight Seek was among the record breakers with a standing press of 187 lbs.



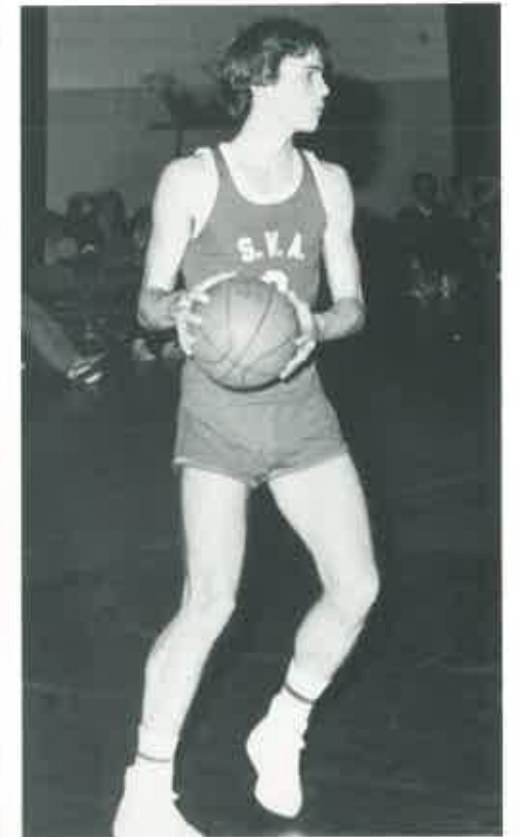
# Iron Man

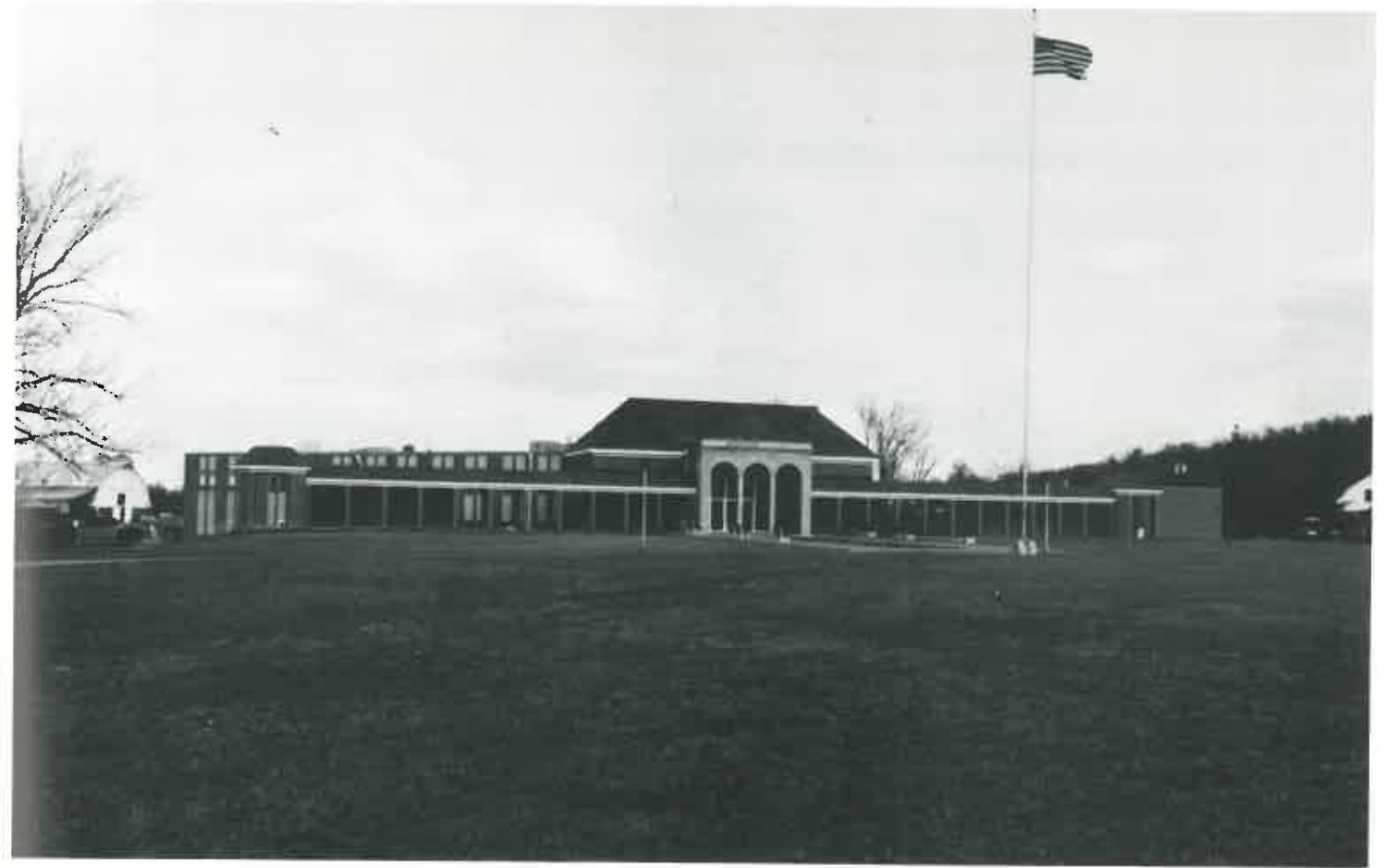

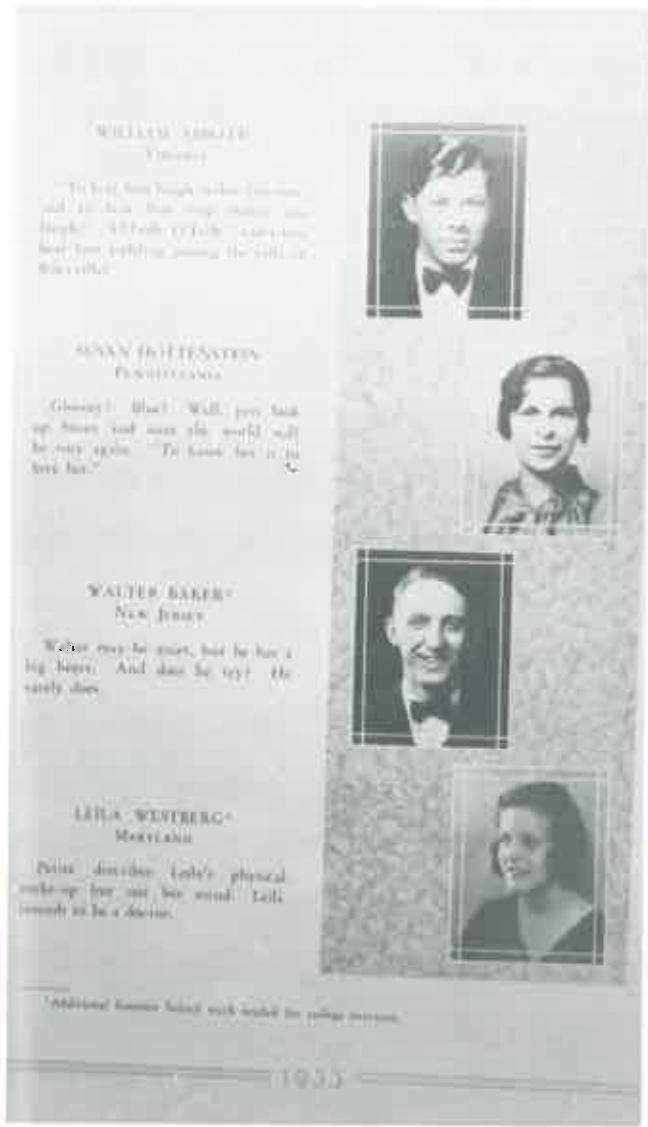




# 50 Years of Memories

This 1982 **Shenandoan** marks the 50th year of yearbooking at S.V.A. The first yearbook, published in 1932, was a 64 page paperback under the name "**Shenandoah**." It contained pictures of students, faculty, and various organizations, presentations of Senior Class Poem, Song, Will, etc., and was dedicated to the faculty of S.V.A.

Except for 1945 and 1946 when no book was formally published because of wartime restrictions, a memory book has been published every year. It evolved from a 64 page, black and white paper back under the name "**Shenandoah**" to a 144 page, colorful hardback volume called the **Shenandoan**. This marks 50 years of yearbooking at Shenandoah Valley Academy, the pictures, the thoughts, and the memories can be cherished for a lifetime, and beyond.
