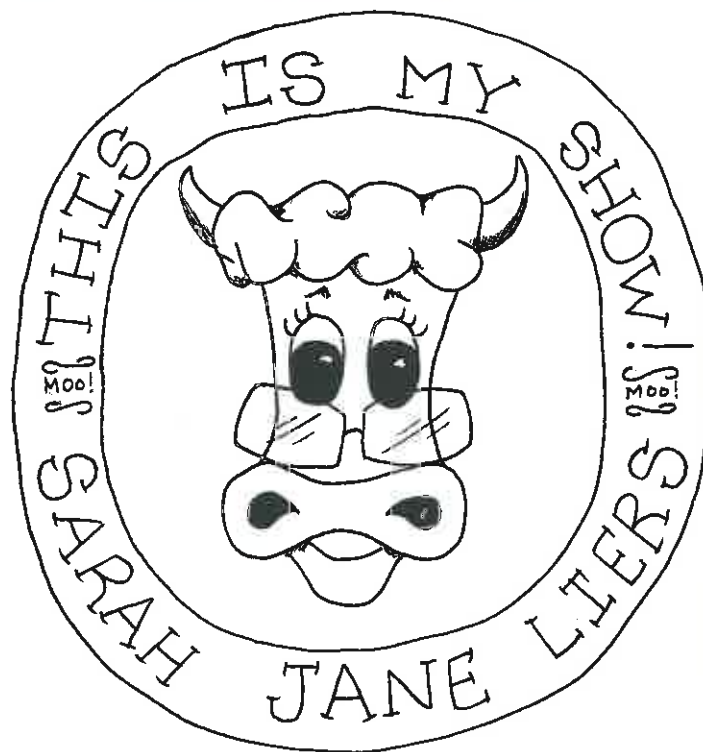

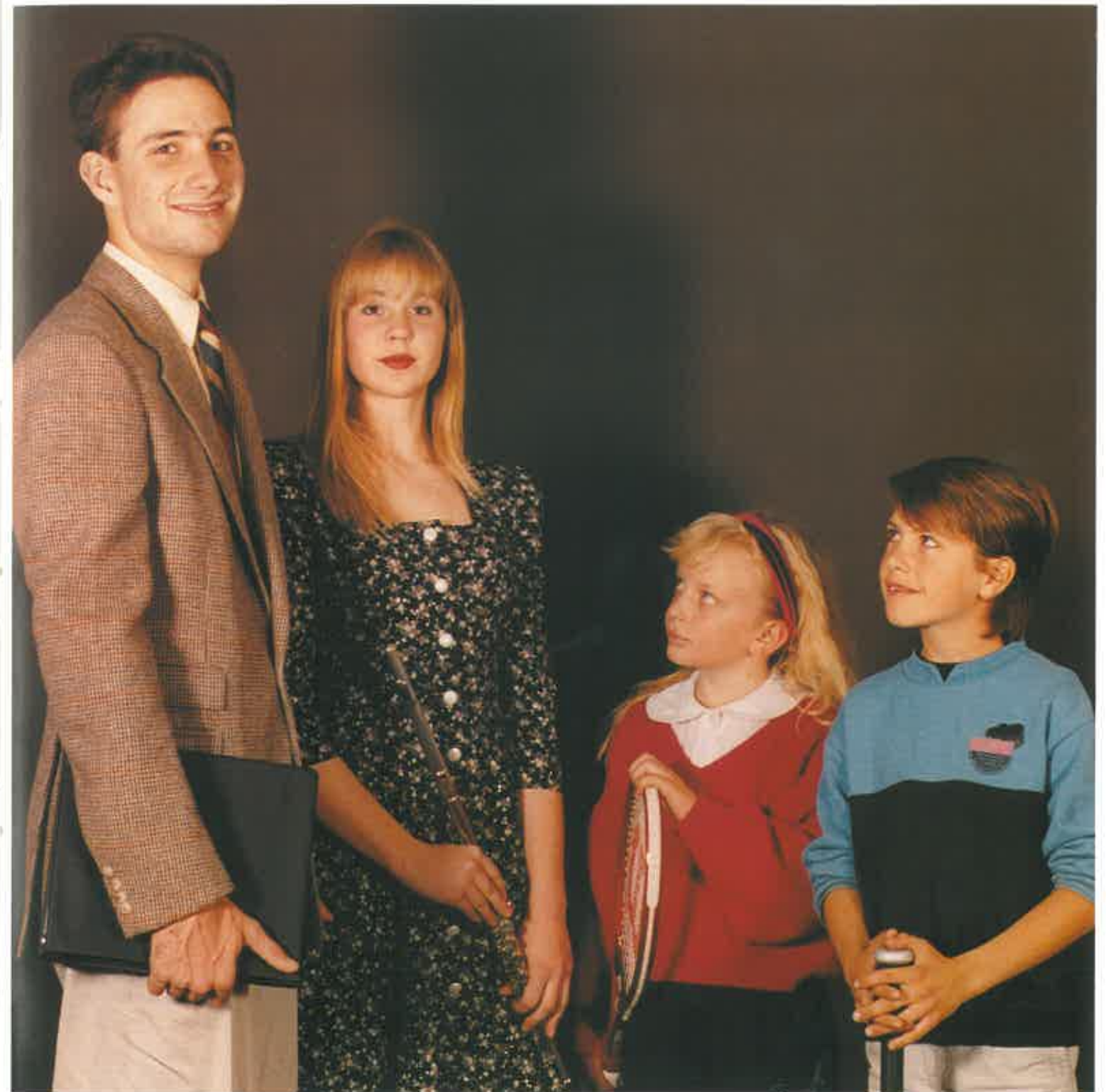
We know that you have been here for

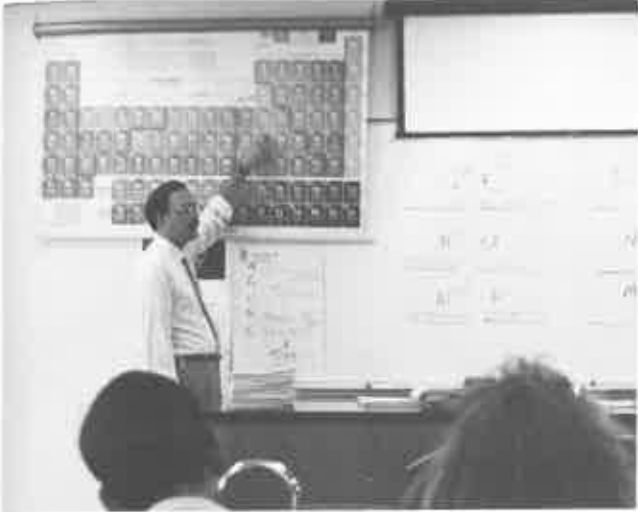

## SYMPHONIC BAND

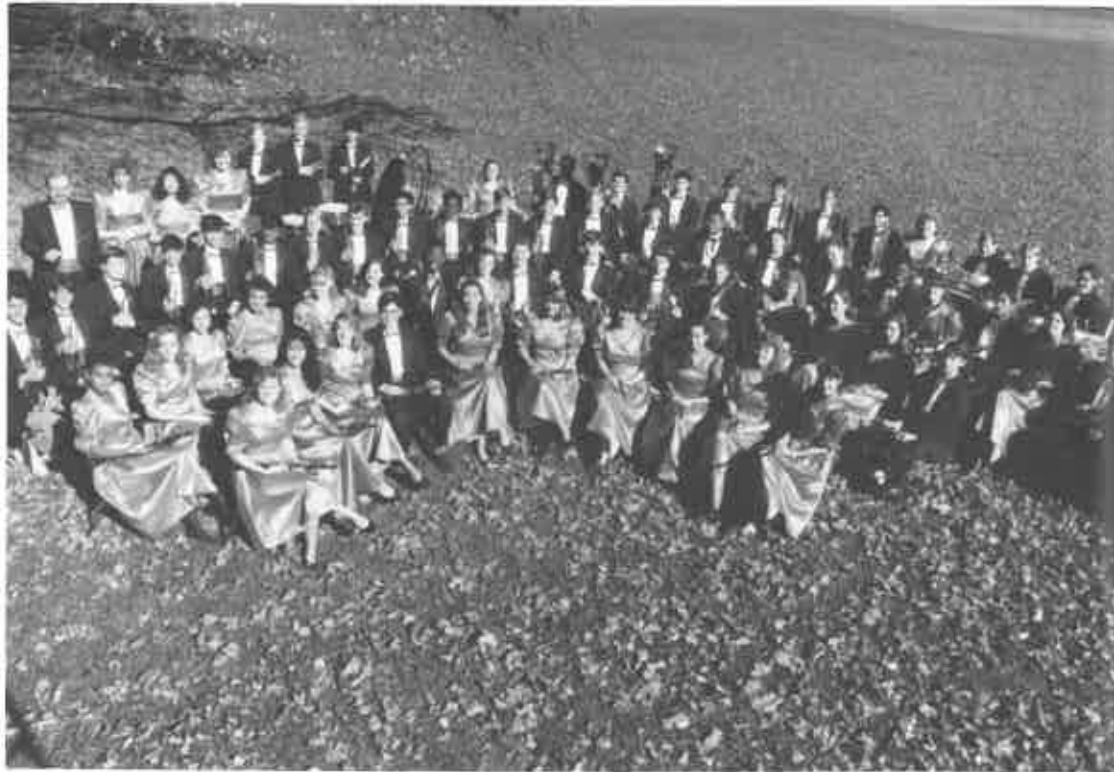

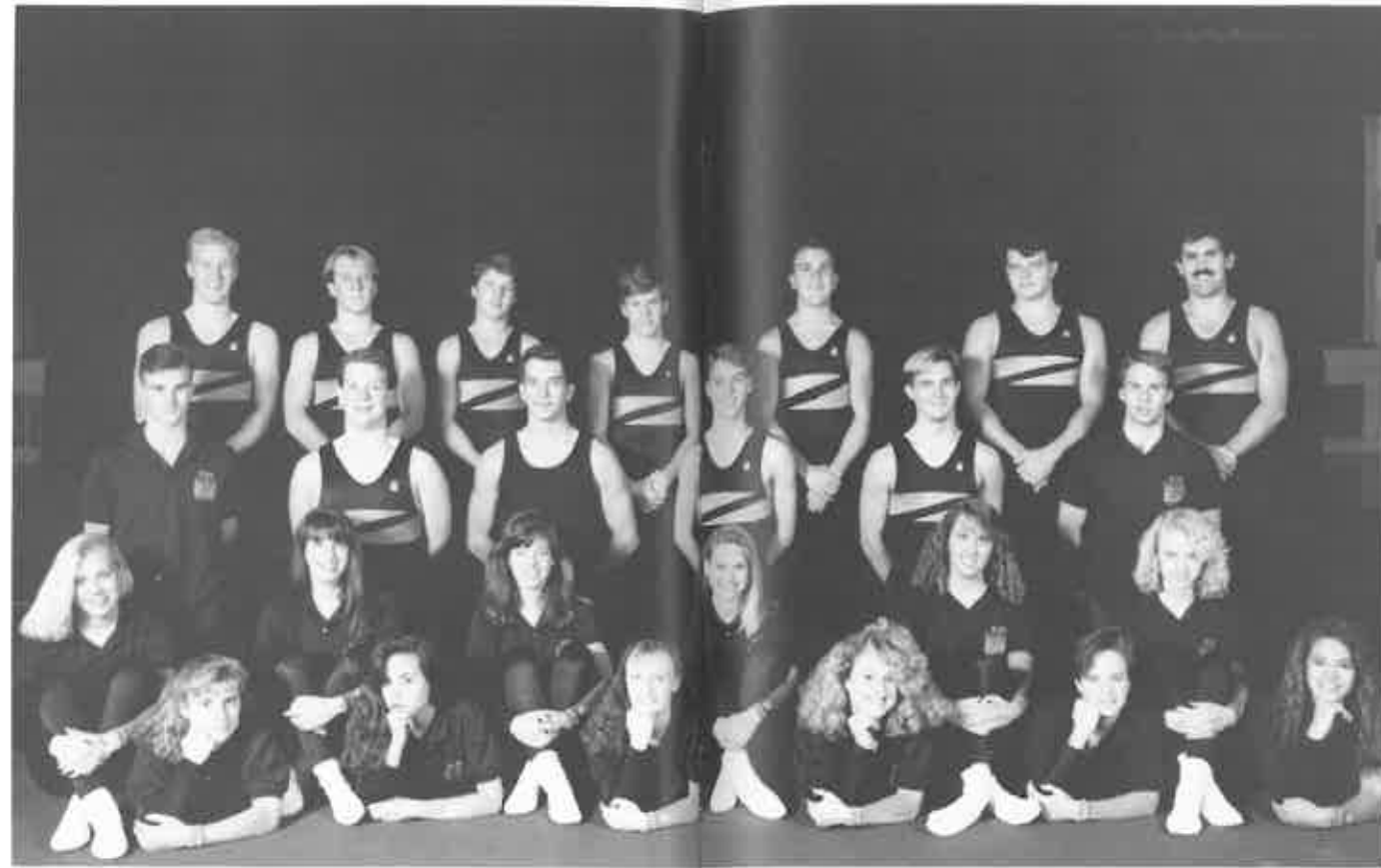

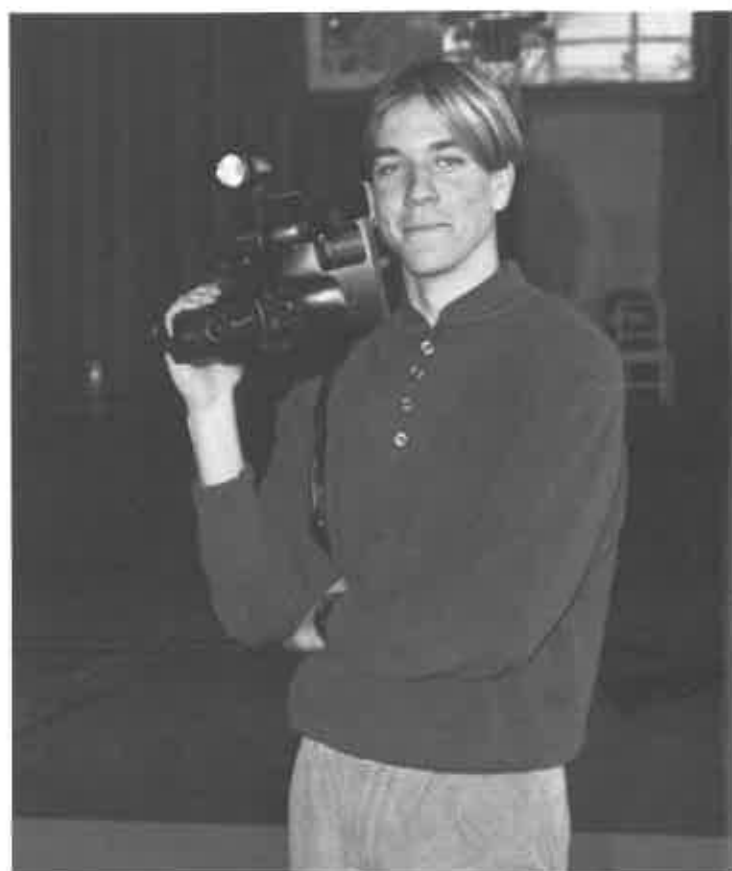

Society.

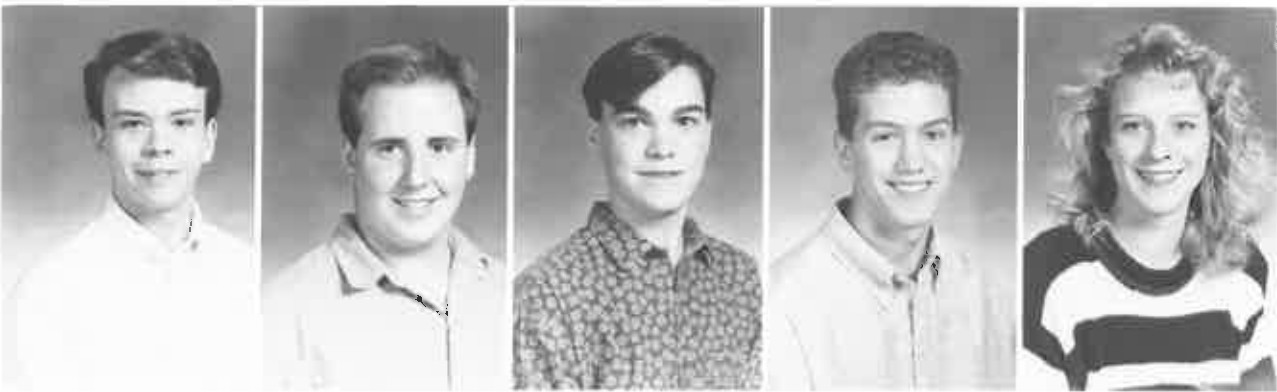
Since our freshman year we have been shy and sometimes scared to stand up for what we believe in. One thing for certain is that we will always be willing to participate and help in any way.

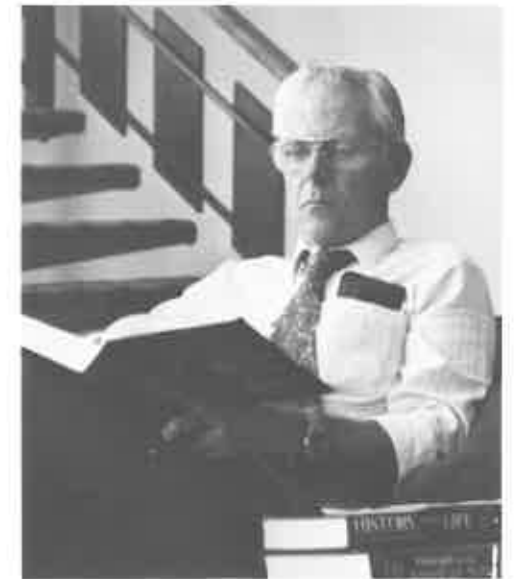
