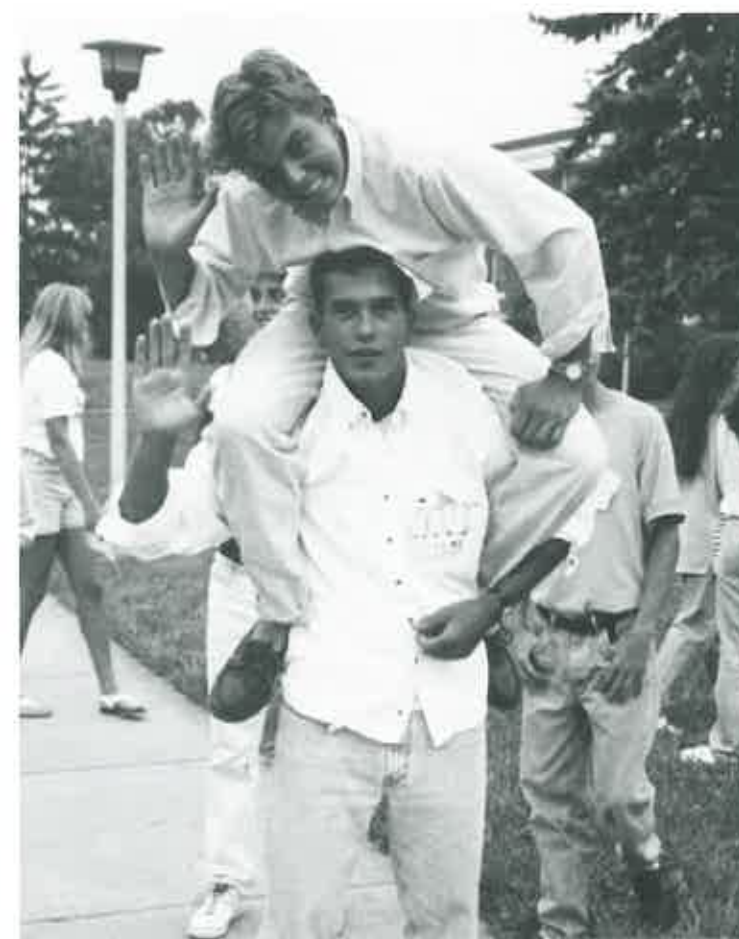

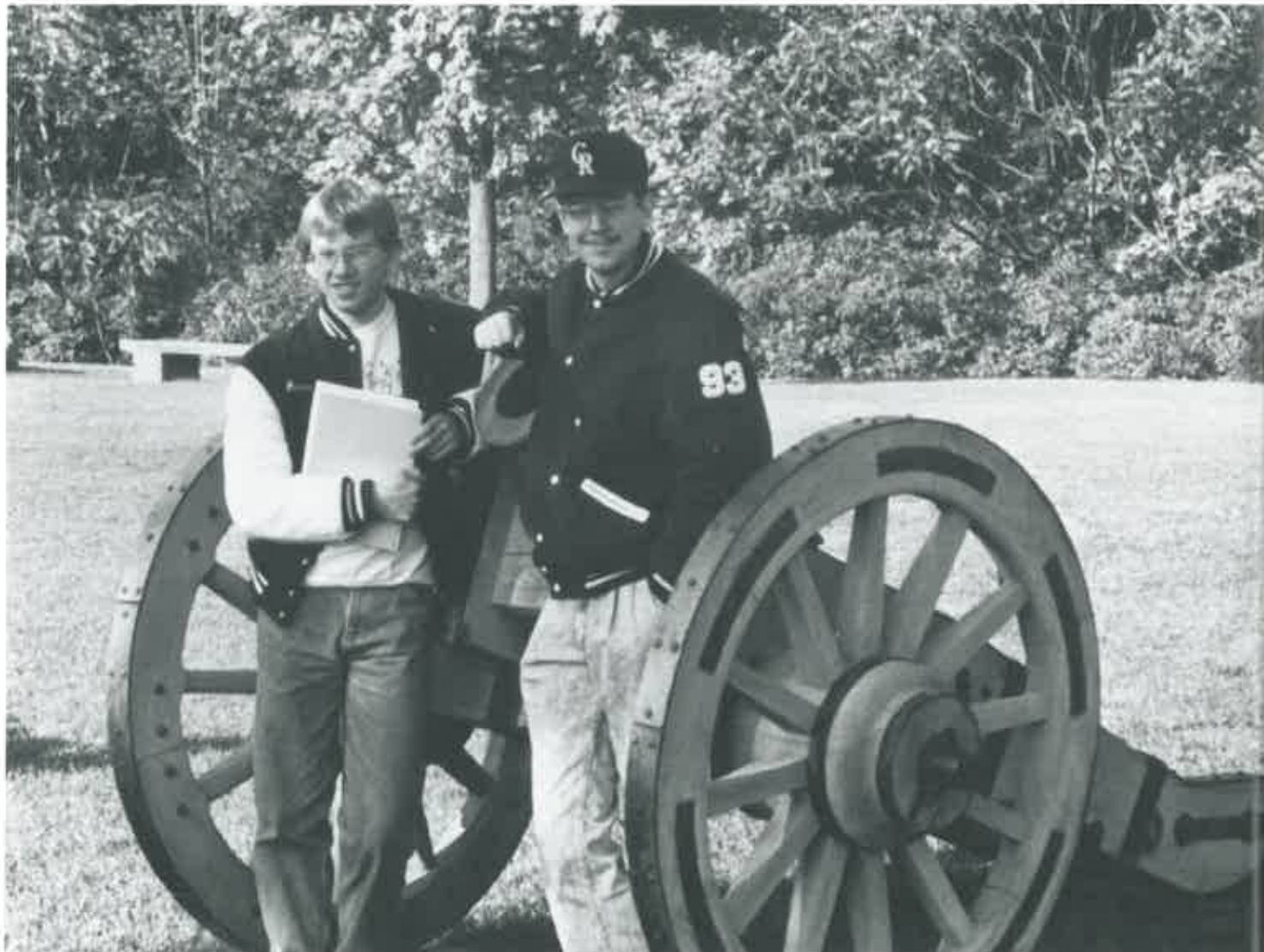
They started on the night of October 6, and after the sardine-packed bus ride, they arrived in Saratoga, New York. After Saratoga, they

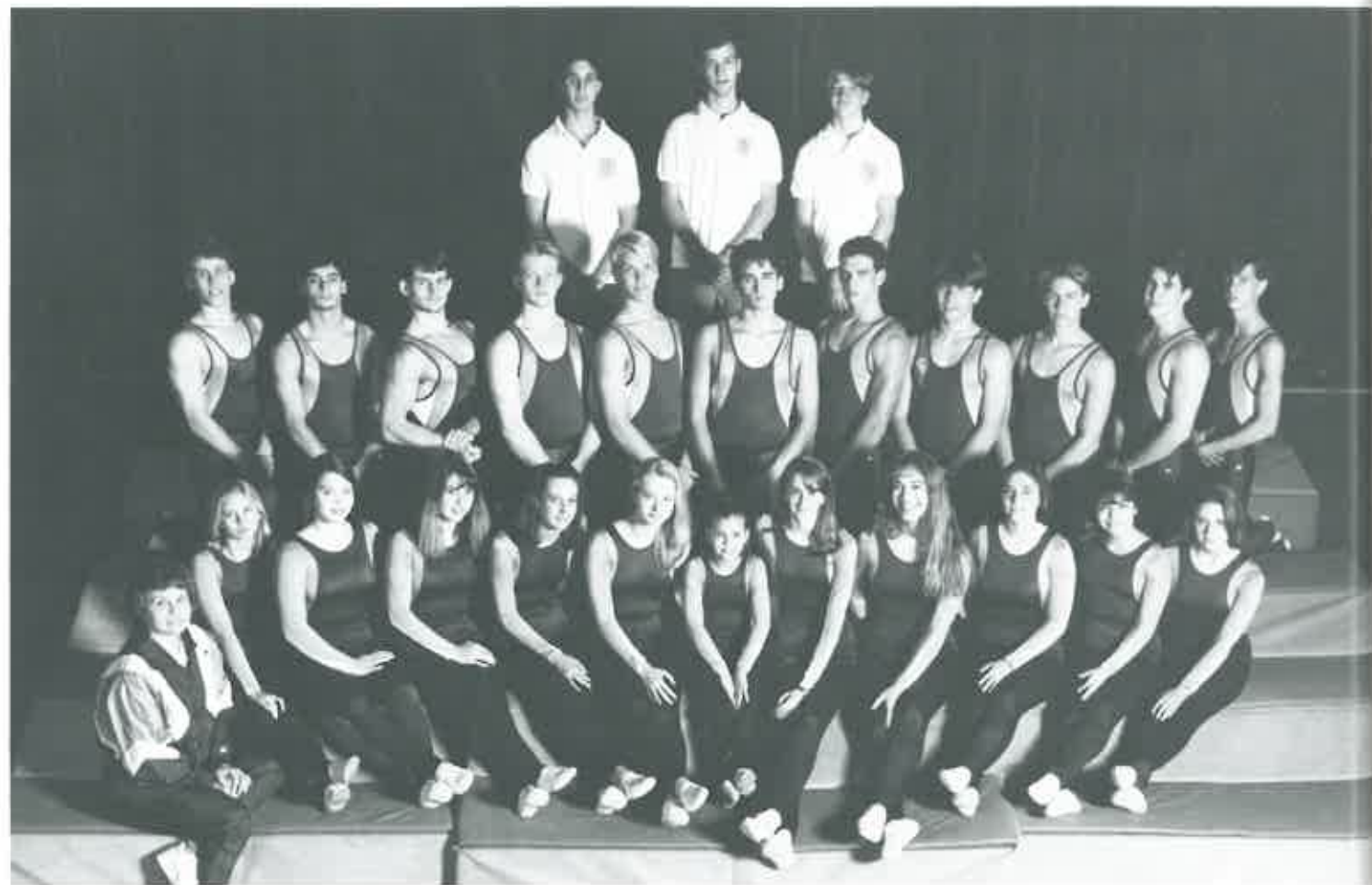


# OLYMPIANS

## THE END OF THE ROAD

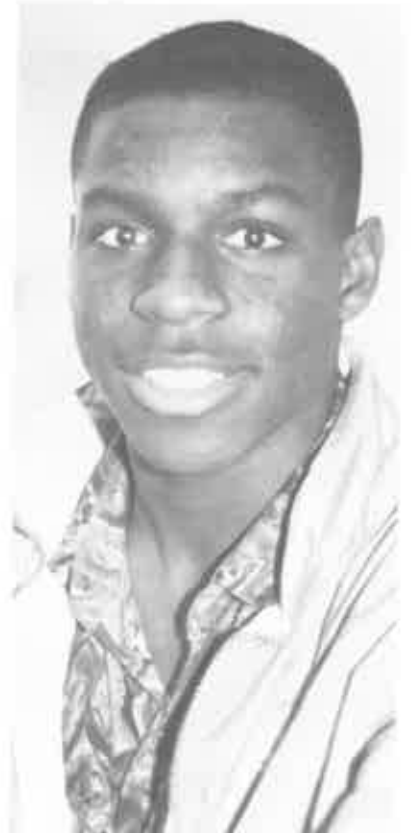
Four years, five months, two
