Sofiane Viegas de Araujo



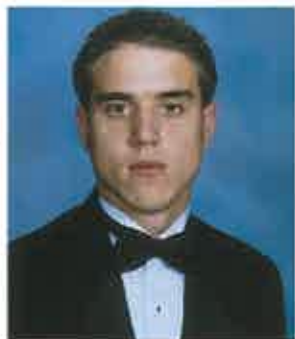

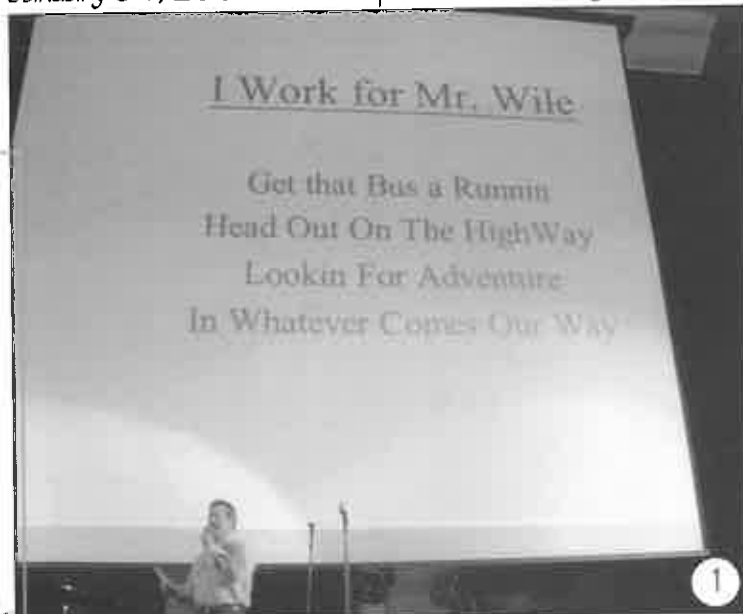
Talent galore as the seniors kick off the 2003-2004 school year

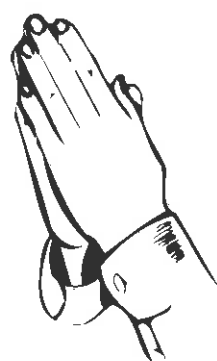

SVA's 2004 Mission trip was a huge success!! Thirty-four SVA students, 10 adults, and one child worked together to change the face of the little Seventh-day Adventist School in Chinle, Arizona. Twenty-five gallons of paint, thousands of dollars worth of materials, and a lot of blood, sweat, and tears went into the building face-lift at Chinle SDA School. Though the building project consumed most of our time, the VBS program held each evening was the greatest success. Organized and run by students and girls' task force deans, dozens of Navajo children were brought closer to Jesus and to our hearts. It's hard to say who had the greater joy, the children or the students who lead out in the music, stories, games, and crafts. There were many tears when it came time to go home. SVA could be very proud of the youth who represented their school on the mission project. Of the past seven mission trips that I have been a part of, this one has been the one that I have most felt the anger of the enemy and seen the power of God revealed to rebuke him.
