


Nicole Michenn Arabe-Emond




The mind is the seat of consciousness in which

Once in London, we saw Big Ben, the changing of the guard, and Westminster Abbey. We also went to the Phantom of the Opera on our last night in London.







SVA's 2004 Mission trip was a huge success!! Thirtyfour SVA students, 10 adults, and one child worked together to change the face of the little Seventh-day Adventist School in Chinle, Arizona. Twenty-five gallons of paint, thousands of dollars worth of materials, and a lot of blood, sweat, and tears went into the building face-lift at Chinle SDA School. Though the building project consumed most of our time, the VBS program held each evening was the greatest success.
